Jesus (God in the flesh who is both Lord and Christ) Died for Our Sins, was Buried, then was Raised from the Dead

Components of this Good News (Gospel) Message of First Importance: Now I make known to you, brethren, the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received, in which also you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast the word which I preached to you, unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that: Christ⁽¹⁾ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁽²⁾ and that He was buried, (3) and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, (4) and that He appeared to Cephas, G then to the twelve. Note: Even though certain elements of the gospel of Jesus Christ were taught prior to the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus (e.g. the good news that the kingdom was coming or at hand), the full message was "a secret and hidden wisdom of God"; "wisdom that none of the rulers of that age understood, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory" (see 1 Corinthians 2:1-8). See also John 16:12-13, Romans 16:25-27, Ephesians 1:9, and Ephesians 3:1-9. Even the angels longed to look on these things (1 Peter 1:10-12). Following the death of Jesus, the new covenant was put in place for Jews and non-Jews (see Hebrews 8:1-13, 9:11-16).

How should we respond to the gospel message?





After we hear the gospel, what choices are available (according to the New Testament) for those of us who are living after the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus?

* also called "baptism" (see Acts 22:16), being "born again" (see 1 Peter 1:23, 1 Peter 3:21, John 3:3-5), the "washing of regeneration" (Titus 3:5), "obeying the Gospel, or heeding the good news" (see Romans 6:1-18, Romans 10:16). The word baptism is from the Greek word baptizo, which means to immerse or dip. When we are baptized, having faith in God's promises, we are doing something that takes the spiritual form of the gospel doctrine in that we are choosing to **Die** to sin (repentance), to be Buried with Christ and into His death, and then Raised to walk in newness of life (Romans 6).

Choice 1 - What Does God Promise If I Do This?

Choice 2 - Any Path Other Than Choice 1

Read the entire New Testament for the risks and warnings about choosing this path. Here are some examples: Luke 6:46-49, 2 Thessalonians 1:6-9, John 12:48, John 8:21-24, and John 14:6.

NOTE: The word "gospel" is from the Greek word εὐαγγέλιον which means "good news." What type of good news is defined by the context in the scripture verse. For example the good news of the kingdom (Matthew 4:23), the beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ (Mark 1:1), the good news of the grace of God (Acts 20:24), the good news of God (Romans 1:1), the good news of your faith and love (1 Thessalonians 3:6), the glad tidings (Romans 10:16), and the gospel of our Lord Jesus (2 Thessalonians 1:8). There is only one gospel of Jesus Christ, however many throughout the ages have tried come up with different false gospels or tried to distort the gospel of Jesus Christ (see Galatians 1:6-9).
